


Transient Traders

Cupar Utility Bills

Please note that all utility bills are due before month end for the month they are issued. Effective immediately, any residences with outstanding accounts on the first of the month will have their water supply shut off unless prior arrangements for payment have been made with the town office. It is the homeowner's responsibility to contact us; we will not be contacting you prior to cut-off. Once water has been shut off there is a \$50.00 reconnect fee added to your bill.

Please understand that the town pays for the water usage to Sask Water each month and delinquent payments hinder our ability to meet our expenses as well. Also, for residents, it is much easier to catch up on a one month payment rather than five months of missed payments.


