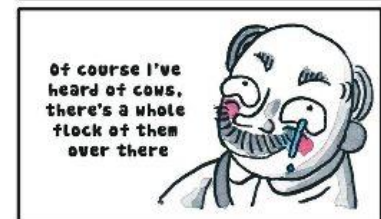

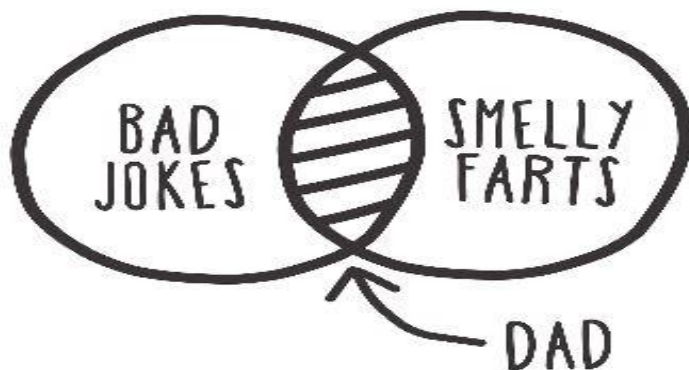


Flag Day June 10th
