Most people in the area understand but the people travelling past may not know. I can state in the three years I have been Fire Chief 90% of field burn calls come from an out of area phone prefix.

We thank each and everyone of you who goes out of their way to help ensure the season causes the least amount of annoyance. It is almost over! We have just about made it through another prairie winter!






Fun facts!!!!
